Eucharistic Procession -April 3 Co-editor Tim McCarthy

Forty Days for Life has started in 247 cities, and 9 countries in 32 international locations. This is a program that starts and ends with God. On Sunday, April 3 at 1:30 P.M. there will be another Eucharistic Procession from St. Agnes Parish on Route 40 to the abortion mill at the Suburbia Building -300 yards west of the Church. County police will help us cross Route 40. YOU are invited.

Locally, we are praying on Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and

Saturday for the close of the Hillcrest abortion mill. (Those are the days when the killings take place). The most significant part of the prayer for many of us is just saying the rosary. We don't carry signs with grotesque-if accurate-pictures. We don't try to block anyone from entering the mill. We don't shout prayers or warnings to people as they pass. We just pray.

As I passed the Johnnycake Road entrance to the mill on March 15 I counted 9 people joined in prayer. I come for an hour on Thursday mornings at II A.M. Many Council members are working then. But if you're free please join me. Last Thursday I prayed alone.
