40 Days For Life Returns — by Co-editor Tim McCarthy

St. Agnes Parish will again host 40 Days for Life beginning September 28 thru November 6. We will join 13,000 churches in 48 states to end child killing by abortion. Canada, England, Germany, Spain, and Australia will join 291 locations for prayer across the Country.

Since the program started 53 abortion workers have quit their jobs, 14 abortion facilities shut down completely, and the lives of 4313 children we can document have been saved. We believe many more have been saved. 400,000 people have agreed to pray and fast for the continued success of

our work.

A major event planned at St. Agnes is the Eucharistic Procession to the Hillcrest abortion mill on September 29. Members of the Knights of Columbus are invited to walk directly behind the monstrance as an Honor Guard. Last September more than 300 people took part. The Hillcrest abortion mill has ended the lives of more than 30,000 children since its opening in 1973.

While we recognize the value of other approaches ours is exclusively a prayer centered approach. If you know how to say the rosary you have all the weapons you need. Some people give an hour a week. The MVA's Emergency Contact Information Registry is Launched

The MVA's emergency contact registry is now live. We would like to invite you to participate in this new customer service initiative.

To participate, please log onto the MVA's website, www.mva.maryland.gov to input the name and contact information of up to three persons whom you would want to be notified in the unfortunate event of a crash or emergency. This is a free, voluntary service that will be used for law enforcement purposes only. The MVA's Emergency Contact Information Registry information is stored electronically on your driving record. The information is very secure and can only be accessed by authorized law enforcement personnel to quickly get word to your loved ones in the event of a serious accident. You can add, modify, or delete your emergency contact information at any time by visiting www.mva.maryland.gov. Any modifications or deletions will overwrite all previously entered information.

According to Administrator Kuo, "The more people who register, the more useful this information will be to law enforcement agencies in the event of an emergency. Signing-up will give you and your family peace of mind that your loved ones will be contacted in case of an emergency."
