## Catholic Persecution Returns —co-editor Tim McCarthy

The HHS mandate takes effect in Catholic colleges and universities in August of this year. The current president of Catholic University is John Garvey. He commented on the HHS mandate that Catholic institutions must make one of four choices: "secularize itself, breaking connection with the Church". He called this a form of theft-denying the Church the right to have," an institutional voice in public life." The second choice is to pay fines at the rate of \$100 a day per employee. Choice three is to, "sell the institution to a non-Catholic group or to a local government. Fourth, close down," he concluded. Hence persecution of Catholics returns. Maryland Catho-

lics have been there before. Prior to the American Revolution Catholics were forbidden to attend Catholic schools at all. To get a Catholic education the rich sent their children to France. Father Charles Carroll was fluent in French because-from the age of 12 he was educated there. For this reason Benjamin Franklin asked Carroll to accompany him to Canada to enlist Canadian aid. The mission failed but Franklin wrote to the Vatican noting the extraordinary gifts of Father Carroll. Historians note that not long after Father Carroll was asked to be America's first archbishop. As Catholics we believe that our most important posses-

sion is our immortal soul. We must keep this in mind as the Constitutional protections that birthed our greatness are gradually taken away. Remaining faithful Catholics will be more difficult in the years ahead.
