Teresa Bartlinski ,who suffered bravely for years with a congenital heart problem, died July 1. She was 6 years old. Teresa's body rejected a heart transplant at the end of June. Doctors at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia tried unsuccessfully to implant an artificial heart until another transplant could be found.

Teresa is the daughter of Ed and Ann Bartlinski. Ed is a member of Patapsco Council. She is the granddaughter of PGK Reggie DiSante, also of our Council.

Father Christopher Whatley, pastor of St. Mark's, called her a saint at the July 6 Funeral Mass. "Teresa did nothing wrong," Father said. "Now Teresa is our intercessor-our saint."

Born in China on Christmas Day of 2006, she was adopted by her parents in 2010. Teresa was the fifth Chinese girl with special needs adopted by the Bartlinskis. The family prayed intensely for a miracle for their daughter, sharing her story on a family website that drew worldwide attention.

Her brother Eddy, In his eulogy, said," She loved picking flowers and asked how many flowers there were in heaven." Now Teresa is in position to check on that herself. Her brother said Teresa's ability to see God in every person inspired him to do the same.

She received permission to receive First Communion when she was four. She said at the time that she was "marrying Jesus." A neighbor, Denise Campbell, said, "She showed us what life is truly all about: love."

Her mother, Ann, said," Her life touched thousands of people all over the world. Only by the power of God could a little orphan with half a heart touch so many lives. Now in heaven she will touch many more lives."

The family prayed for a miracle for Teresa. Father Whatley said the caring, Jesus centered, life she lived was that miracle.
