

CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE



Father Gene Nickol

Brothers of the Patapsco Council:

I hope you have been having a restful and renewing summer season; God's gift to us so we can answer His call. "Come to me, all you who labor and find life burdensome, and I will give you rest ... learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart, and your souls will find rest, for my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

You may wonder: "How does that work?" To understand, you must also hear Jesus say that we must "become like little children." What is it that little children have that we adults, the learned and clever, do not have? This is important to understand. Little children are vulnerable because they have no power and completely depend on others to take care of them. They are very open and trusting that others will share with them what they need; they have no allusion that they are in charge or that they can do well on their own, with no one to help them. They gratefully accept the help of others.

We adults, however, think we are in charge; that we can do it alone and, as a matter of American pride, feel we can be so fiercely independent and free that we need no one else to help us or tell us what to do. That's why Jesus has to tell us to be "like little children," because all these "adult qualities" are what get us into trouble and take us away from God.

Look at the example of Jesus who, throughout the Gospels, as the Divine Son, was constantly praying to and seeking grace, guidance and strength from His Heavenly Father. Let's face it—to carry the burden of being able to do it all, to be independent of God and everyone else, is a huge burden. Jesus invites us as adult Catholic Christians to let go of these burdens and place them in God's hands. To trust that God is with us, as God was with Jesus, every step of the way. And to, like Jesus, give our lives, challenges, struggles and weaknesses over to God and let God into our lives to heal, forgive, lift our sorrows, and be our strength.

This is what really will refresh and renew us. We are not alone—God is with us every step of the way.

We are true children of the Heavenly Father, and we can find rest from our labors and burdens in Him.







NOTES FROM THE GOOD OLD DAYS

n the 1950s, parents could send the kids off to watch television when old friends called. With the "Hayes Code" of Hollywood (equivalent to today's rating system) still in effect, children would see good triumph over evil. Priests, ministers, and rabbis were always the good guys, and sexual suggestions ended when the bedroom door closed.

But the Hayes Code is gone now, and the culture that empowered it no longer exists. In the 1950s, everyone knew what was right and what was wrong—even those who chose to break the rules.

In today's society, killing an unborn child is a "woman's choice." (I've always wondered how there could be such a choice if the "woman" weren't already a mother.) "My body, my choice," is an invitation to try drugs. "Looking out for number one," is not a call to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to the masses.

The Judeo-Christian ethic and the culture that surrounds us are strangers. Adultery and fornication—whether between man and woman, man and man, or woman and woman—are still serious sins. That cannot change, simply because God's Justice permits no such change. How could God send someone to Hell for these sins a hundred years ago, but simply write it off as a cultural norm today?

What that means for us is that it's tougher to do the right thing; however, doing the right thing is no less vital. Our journey on earth is a temporary assignment. Eternity is forever.

K of C Pledges \$1.4 Million for Special Olympics World Games



The Knights of Columbus formally announced a donation to cover the costs of athletes from the United States and Canada during their time in Los Angeles as they participate in next year's Special Olympics World Games.

The Knights' \$1.4 million sponsorship will cover the costs of food, transportation and entertainment for every athlete from the two countries during their time in Los Angeles.

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson made the announcement during a news conference on July 14 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. Joining him at the announcement was World Games CEO and President Patrick McClenahan and Archbishop of Los Angeles José H. Gomez. "The Knights of Columbus were there with Special Olympics and its founder, Eunice Kennedy Shriver, from the very beginning," said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Our support exemplifies our commitment to the dignity of every person, our dedication to assisting with our neighbors' needs whatever they may be, and our deep appreciation for the great work done by Special Olympics."

Anderson also announced that he is asking the leadership of the Knights of Columbus in each U.S. state and Canadian province to increase the number of volunteer hours donated to Special Olympics this year.
