### New Record for Shredding Day at Patapsco Council



Patapsco Council hosted a Community Shredding Day on Saturday , April 28th. The Shredding Truck was provided by Vangel Inc. of Baltimore and Valerie S. Androutsopoulos told us that this was the largest shredding day ever for Patapsco Council. The truck was full with 12,475 pounds worth of shredded paper material, and 609 pounds of electronics. Valerie told us that for each ton of paper, which there were 6 plus tons, there are 17 trees saved, 7,000 gallons of water, 683 gallons of oil and 42,00 kilowatts of energy conserved. So this effort saved over 100 trees, great effort on behalf of the Council.
